Calestous Juma, Professor of the Practice of International Development at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government and Director of the Science, Technology and Globalization Project. He is coordinator of the UN Millennium Project's Task Force on Science, Technology and Innovation whose report, *Innovation: Applying Knowledge in Development*, was presented to UN Secretary-General in January 2005. Juma served as Chancellor of the University of Guyana until 2003 and is a member of the President's National Economic and Social Council of Kenya. Professor Juma is a former Executive Secretary of the United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity and founding director of the African Centre for Technology Studies in Nairobi. He is a Fellow of the New York Academy of Sciences and the World Academy of Art and Science and member of the Kenya National Academy. In 2005 he was elected to the US National Academy of Sciences where he has served on several committees on agriculture, genetic resources, science advice, geographical information sciences and biotechnology. He has won several international awards for his work on environment and development. He holds a PhD in science and technology policy studies, and has written widely on science, technology and the environment.
